**Local Transportation**

Public transportation (buses) is good. Students may ride the public bus for free with their GVSU ID card. GVSU operates a shuttle bus between the Grand Rapids downtown and Allendale campuses. Bus stops are located across the street from ELS and a 5-10 minute walk from the dorm. ELS students are eligible to get a Michigan Drivers License for \$25 (no credit cards) and there are fewer requirements if students have their national license (not an international permit) and it is translated into English by a certified agency. The Center has details about additional requirements.

**Smoking Policy**

Smoking is not permitted in the ELS Center, but students may smoke outdoors in designated areas.

**Housing Check-in and Departure**

Students with confirmed ELS housing reservations should go directly to their assigned housing upon arrival (not to the ELS Center) on the Sunday before their course begins. Checkout is the Saturday after the program ends. Arrivals and departures on dates/times other than those listed require special approval.

**Student Residence / Dorm****Grand Valley State University (GVSU)****Winter Hall at 32 Winter Avenue****Grand Rapids, Michigan**

Downtown GVSU student residence. Students can take a free bus to the ELS Center.

**Rooms (standard option): Singles (1 person)**

Students have their own bedroom in a shared suite in this urban student residence. Shared suite-style bathrooms. Suites include full size refrigerator, stove, microwaves may be available, dining table and chairs. Big screen TV, gym located in building. Linens are also included and can be changed weekly. Students clean their own suite during stay.

**Rooms (other): Married Couple Rooms**

Married Couple rooms may be available on campus with prior arrangements if both parties study at ELS.

**Meals Included: None** - Can purchase a GVSU cafeteria meal card after arrival.

**Age Minimum: 18+ years old**

17 year old students can stay in student residence option with parental permission.

**Laundry Facilities:** Self-service machines are available on each floor for a small fee.

**Security/Resident Assistant:** Key card-access building. A resident assistant lives in the dormitory.

**Check-In: 12 noon to 10:00 pm (Sunday) check-in**

During standard check-in hours, students with confirmed reservations report to Winter Hall at 32 Winter Avenue. Push the call box phone button and dial 1-7600 (or look for note with other instructions) to reach the desk assistant. The desk assistant provides keys to the room. Students arriving before the check in date (Sunday before the session begins) must check into a hotel until that Sunday. If your plane will not arrive until after the check-in time (9 pm, as it takes about 1 hour from landing to get to Winter Hall) on Sunday you also must check into a hotel for the night. Please see the list to the right. On Monday go directly to the Center for orientation. On Monday afternoon you may check into Winter Hall. If your plane has been unexpectedly delayed on Sunday and you will arrive after the check-in time (9 pm) please call the ELS Help Line at 1(800) 435-7357 (1-800-HELP-ELS) for assistance in finding you a hotel.

** Homestays**

**Rooms: Single (1 person)**

**Meals Included: 16 per week** (daily continental breakfasts/dinners with lunches added on weekends)

**Age Minimum: 14+ years old**

**Flight Information:** Homestay students should notify their Host Families or ELS of their arrival times so that families will know to be home when they arrive.

**Transportation to ELS:** Host family students are responsible for their personal transportation. Most students use the bus to get to campus.

**Check-In: 10:00 am to 9:00 pm (Sunday) check-in**

Students go directly to homestay address. Only students under the age of 18 may get permission to check in to a homestay early. All other students must go to a hotel if arriving before the check-in date (Sunday before the session begins)

**Checkout Time:** 1:00 pm (Saturday)

** Airport Arrival Information**

ELS Language Centers recommends that students choose the ELS Airport Pickup Service for arrivals (booked through ELS Central Admissions), however other transportation options are also available.

**Other Transportation Options From the Airport:**

Taxis from Grand Rapids Int'l airport to the downtown Winter Hall or homestays will cost approximately \$25 to \$40 plus tips, with a travel time of 20-40 minutes. Taxis to the Allendale campus or homestays will cost approximately \$50-\$75 plus tips, with a travel time of 40-50 minutes.
