Local Transportation
 Seattle has excellent public transport, with free public buses in the downtown area, the monorail from downtown to “Seattle Center”, the Seattle Streetcar connecting Pike Place Market and Pioneer Square by way of the waterfront. Ferries also take passengers for excursions across Puget Sound at an approximate cost of \$8 round trip. Homestay students usually buy a monthly bus pass (\$65-\$80 per month) for transportation to and from the ELS Center.

Smoking Policy
 Smoking is not permitted in the ELS Center or in the ELS apartment residence option.

Housing Check-in and Departure
 Students with confirmed ELS housing reservations should go directly to their assigned housing upon arrival (not to the ELS Center) on the Sunday before their course begins. Checkout is the Saturday after the program ends. Arrivals and departures on dates/times other than those listed require special approval.

 **Student Residence / Dorm**

First Hill Apartments
400 10th Avenue

Males & females are placed in separate apartments although apartment floors are coed. Americans also live at the First Hill apartments and may reside on the same floor (different apartments).

Rooms (standard option): Doubles (2 person)

Two students share a room in a 2-bedroom (4 person) apartment-style residence with a shared bathroom (1 bathroom/per 4 people). Each apartment has a furnished kitchen, desk, chairs, and living room with TV. Apartments include 4 beds (2 in each room) and closets. Linens are also included. Students clean their own rooms and apartment during their stay.

Meals Included: No meals included.

Age Minimum: 16+ years old

Laundry Facilities: Self-service machines are available in the dorm apartment building (small fee).

Security/Resident Assistant: During working hours, there is a front desk for security. After hours, the front door is locked and a key is needed to enter. There are no resident assistants.

Check-In: 11:00 am to 5:00 pm (Sunday) check-in

During standard check-in hours, report to the front desk at First Hill Apartments. The Residence Assistant will have keys ready. If you are unable to check in between these hours, please contact the Center to schedule the front desk person for your arrival.

Damage/Key Deposit: \$50 damage deposit

Checkout Time: Noon (Saturday)

 **Homestays**

Rooms: Single (1 person)

Meals Included: 16 per week (daily continental breakfasts/dinners with lunches added on weekends)

Age Minimum: 16+ years old

Flight Information: Homestay students should notify ELS of their arrival times prior to arrival, so that families will know to be home when they arrive.

Transportation to ELS: Host family students are responsible for their personal transportation. Most students come to the campus by bus from Seattle suburban areas.

Check-In: 8:00 am to 10:00 pm (Sunday) check-in

Students go directly to assigned homestay address.

Checkout Time: 12 noon (Saturday)

 **Apartment Options in the Area**

Contact ELS/Seattle at sea@els.edu for information and assistance on pre-booking private furnished apartments for family clients or couples. Studios, 1-bedroom, 2-bedroom, and loft apartments are dependent on availability. Prices vary by season and apartment type. Approximate prices range between \$1500 (studio) to \$3500 (lofts).

 **Airport Arrival Information**

Other Transportation Options From the Airport:

Taxis from Seattle-Tacoma Int'l airport to the dorm or homestays will cost approximately \$45 plus tip, with a travel time of about 25 minutes.

Super Shuttle service can take students any where in Seattle area and is also available by calling the call number 48 from the "Hotel Reservations" desk. The phone clerk tells students where to find the shuttle. Super Shuttle to the downtown costs about \$35.
